

ADVANCED 'FIND SOMEONE WHO' ACTIVITY

Find someone who has learned a skill that you don't have. Find out how, when, and where they learned it.	Find someone who has a plan for something they want to do in future. Ask questions about this plan.
Find someone who knows an English word or phrase you don't know. Ask them to teach you this vocabulary and its meaning.	Find someone who likes a food you don't like. Ask them questions about this food and find out what they like about it.
Find someone who has a different hobby or interest from you. Ask questions to find out how they got interested in this thing.	Find someone who has travelled to a place you would really like to see. Ask them to describe what they did and saw there.
Find someone who has watched a movie you know nothing about. Get them to tell you about the story of the movie and its main characters.	Find someone whose family is much bigger or smaller than your own family. Ask questions to find out more about their experience of family life.
Find someone who uses social media much more or much less than you use it. Ask them questions to find out more about their attitude to social media and their level of interest in it.	Find someone who has a different daily routine from you (including getting up, meals, activities, and bedtimes). Ask them questions to find out why they chose this routine.
Find someone who likes a band or musician that you don't know. Ask them to describe their music and decide if it sounds like something you'd enjoy listening to.	Find someone who has had an experience you would find exciting (in a good way, or a scary way). Get them to describe what happened, and get them talking about their feelings about it.
Find someone who has a different opinion from you on a social or political issue. Listen to their ideas and try to find out the reasons behind their opinion.	Find someone who has strong opinions on a topic you know little about. Get them to talk about their views and try to find out why they are so passionate about this topic.
Find someone who is interested in a subject or topic that you don't really understand. Ask them to teach you something about this topic, and find out what motivates them to learn about it.	Find someone who has a different personality from you. Talk with them about personality types and about their experience of life, and pay them a compliment on their personality.
